ERDAS IMAGINE 2020 Update 3

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About This Release

This document describes enhancements in ERDAS IMAGINE 2020 Update 3 (v16.6.3), including IMAGINE Photogrammetry (formerly LPS Core) and ERDAS ER Mapper. Although the information in this document is current as of the product release, see the Hexagon Geospatial Support website for the most current version.

Update 3 includes both enhancements and fixes. For information on fixes that were made to ERDAS IMAGINE, see the <u>Issues Resolved</u> section.

This document is only an overview and does not provide all the details about the product's capabilities. See the online help and other documents provided with ERDAS IMAGINE for more information.

Development of ERDAS IMAGINE 2020 ensures all aspects of ERDAS IMAGINE run in 64-bit. Consequently, the installer has been split into three separate installers: ERDAS IMAGINE 2020 64-bit; ERDAS IMAGINE 2020 32-bit; and ERDAS ER Mapper 2020. The same split is available for Update 3 installers.

ERDAS IMAGINE Product Tiers

ERDAS IMAGINE performs advanced remote sensing analysis and spatial modelling to create added information. You can also visualize results in 2D, 3D, or video and on cartographic-quality map compositions. The core of the ERDAS IMAGINE product suite is scalable to your geospatial data. Optional modules (add-ons) provide specialized functions to enhance productivity.

IMAGINE Essentials is the entry-level image processing product for map creation and simple feature collection tools. IMAGINE Essentials enables serial batch processing.

IMAGINE Advantage enables advanced spectral processing; image registration; mosaicking and image analysis; and change detection capabilities. IMAGINE Advantage allows you to process parallel batches for faster output.

IMAGINE Professional includes a production toolset for spatial modeling and advanced spectral, hyperspectral, and radar processing. This tier includes ERDAS ER Mapper at no additional cost.

IMAGINE Photogrammetry maximizes productivity with state-of-the-art photogrammetric satellite and aerial image processing algorithms.



New Platforms

Full Installers

Starting with ERDAS IMAGINE 2020 Update 1, update installers became full installers, allowing you to either install the update as a standalone (e.g., install ERDAS IMAGINE 2020 Update 3 without first installing ERDAS IMAGINE 2020) or as an update to an existing install (e.g., installing ERDAS IMAGINE 2020 Update 3 without first installing ERDAS IMAGINE 2020 Update 1). With full installers, you can no longer roll back an update to the previous version (e.g., If ERDAS IMAGINE 2020 entirely). Consequently, "rolling back" now involves uninstalling ERDAS IMAGINE and re-installing the desired previous version.

ArcGIS 10.7.x and ArcGIS 10.8.x

ERDAS IMAGINE 2020 Update 3 (32-bit) has been tested and is supported when using an installed and licensed version of ArcGIS 10.6, 10.6.1, 10.7, 10.7.1, 10.8, or 10.8.1 to provide geodatabase support libraries.

Alternatively, the IMAGINE Geodatabase Support component (based on ArcGIS Engine 10.7) can be installed to provide geodatabase support.

PostgreSQL & PostGIS

The PostGIS Features Proxy reader now supports PostgreSQL 13.2 with PostGIS 3.1.1.

Licensing

ERDAS IMAGINE 2020 installers no longer attempt to automatically install geospatial licensing tools as part of the installer. If customers wish to use geospatial licensing tools, for example, to set up a floating/concurrent license server, you must download Geospatial Licensing 2020 separately.

We strongly recommend upgrading to the newest version of Geospatial Licensing 2020. If you are unsure of your current version, refer to the Microsoft[®] Windows Add or Remove Programs utility.

New Technology

New Photogrammetry Workflows in Spatial Modeler

Over the past several years, the amount of data from image acquisition systems have grown exponentially due, in part, to the growth of lower-cost UAV platforms and constellations of satellites. This effect is seen not only in the imagery's spatial resolution but also in the frequency of acquisition, with daily revisit rates becoming the norm. This trend increases the need to process data automatically and quickly.

Photogrammetry workflows (e.g., adjustment, ortho rectification, color balancing, mosaicing) are usually the initial steps of data processing. To handle this large volume of imagery, you need photogrammetric solutions that can detect new acquisitions automatically; instantly process data; scale up computing resources as needed; and feed output to downstream geospatial processes.


Spatial Modeler is designed to solve these challenges by offering hundreds of operators that easily chain together into models to solve complex geospatial problems.

With the ERDAS IMAGINE 2020 Update 2 release, we expanded Spatial Modeler's capabilities by adding a new suite of photogrammetry operators that perform project setup, automatic point measurement, triangulation and mosaicing for scanned frame, and digital frame cameras.

In ERDAS IMAGINE 2020 Update 3, we continue this process by expanding the operators into the satellite sensors via RPC and rigorous orbital pushbroom model support.

Note that many of these new operators require additional licensing in order to run as part of a spatial model execution. This is generally noted in the Help for each operator.

Create Semi-Global Matching (SGM) Point Cloud




Note: This operator requires IMAGINE DSM Extractor licenses in order to run.

This operator extracts a dense point cloud from a pair of stereo images using Semi-Global Matching (SGM). Unlike the Create SGM Point Cloud Output operator (which has been deprecated) the Create SGM Point Cloud is a streaming operator that does not need to output the surface model to a file. This is more suited to use in larger spatial models that perform downstream processing on the surface data.

Additionally, this operator offers a PostingSkipFactor option. The posting skip factor (a value of 1 or greater) specifies how many pixels will be skipped in the stereo pair in the X and Y directions during terrain extraction. Lower skip factor leads to denser point cloud output, and higher skip factor reduces computation time but leads to a sparser point cloud output.








Define Image Parameters for Orbital Pushbroom Model

This defines the parameters which describe an image collected using an orbital pushbroom sensor. Additionally, parameters related to how the sensor is modelled or adjusted for the particular image may be specified in the InterpolationType, InterpolationParameter, PolynomialOrders and StandardDeviations options.

This operator is provided to handle orbital pushbroom models for which the image parameters are not automatically read by Spatial Modeler. The image parameters for known orbital pushbroom models may be automatically obtained using the Read Image Parameters For Orbital Pushbroom Model operator.


Define Block Parameters for Orbital Pushbroom Model



This defines the parameters needed to create a block for the management of orbital pushbroom images.




Read Image Parameters for Orbital Pushbroom Model




This operator reads the orbital pushbroom sensor model metadata associated with a given image file and returns it as a dictionary containing ImageParameters as described in Define Image Parameters for Orbital Pushbroom Model operator. There are many different satellite systems that use the orbital pushbroom sensor model; however, the way the metadata is represented can vary from sensor to sensor. There is a dedicated format decoder for each of the supported orbital pushbroom sensor types. This operator uses those decoders to ingest the metadata and make it available in a common internal form defined in the "Define Image Parameters for Orbital Parameters for Orbital Parameters for Orbital Parameters."

Define Image Parameters for Rational Function Model



This defines the parameters which describe a collected image using a rational function sensor.

Define Block Parameters for Rational Function Model



This operator defines the dictionary needed to create a Rational Function Block. Currently, other than the SensorCategory of RationalFunction which is automatically populated by this operator, there are no additional parameters needed.




Add Orthos to Block



Note: This operator requires IMAGINE Advantage licenses or higher in order to run.

The operator adds one or more ortho images to a block. The added ortho images can be used in operations such as mosaicking where the block is used as input.

Read Image Parameters for Rational Function Model




This operator reads the rational function sensor model metadata associated with a given image file and returns it as a dictionary containing ImageParameters as described in the Define Image Parameters for Rational Function Model operator. There are several satellite systems that use the rational function sensor model; however, the way the metadata represents can vary from sensor to sensor. There is a dedicated format decoder for each of the supported rational function sensor types.. This operator uses those decoders to ingest the metadata and make it available in a common internal form defined in the Define Image Parameters for Rational Function Model operator.

New Artificial Intelligence Semantic Segmentation Operators for Spatial Modeler

Hexagon continues to add operators to Spatial Modeler. New (or modified) operators are outlined below, with a brief description of their capabilities. See the ERDAS IMAGINE 2020 Help for complete details on each operator, and visit the Hexagon Geospatial Community Spatial Recipes page for examples of spatial models that use many of these capabilities.

Initialize Image Segmenter



This operator produces a Machine Intellect by training a deep neural network. You case use this Machine Intellect to perform semantic segmentation on images using the Segment Image Using Deep Learning operator.


Semantic Segmentation is a term more commonly used in computer vision and is increasingly used in remote sensing. It is another term for the classical pixel level image classification in remote sensing. As such, all




applications that start with image classification (e.g., land cover mapping, precision agriculture, and road network detection) will benefit from this deep learning-based approach to image classification.

The Image Segmenter is trained using example image tiles (approximately 224 x 224 pixels) with corresponding label images which show the class distribution in the training images.

Segment Image Using Deep Learning



This operator performs semantic segmentation on the input raster and assigns a class and probability that the class is correct for each pixel. This is done using the trained deep learning-based image segmenter specified on the MachineIntellect port.




For example, the screenshots below show a multi-class semantic segmentation of satellite data to identify buildings, roads, etc.





Updated Operators


Mosaic Images




Note: This operator requires IMAGINE Advantage licenses or higher in order to run.

The Mosaic Images operator now accepts a list of input filenames rather than requiring a block as input. This enables you to mosaic existing ortho images.

Point Input



The Point Input operator has been enhanced to provide an input dialog that integrates with the Inquire Cursor. This allows you to easily select the point location for input to a Spatial Model. For example, if you use the Grow Region operator, you may want to use the Inquire Cursor to pick the location in which to grow.





Spatial Model Editor Interface Improvements

The process of starting a new Spatial Model Editor panel has been difficult to navigate in the past. To make this process easier and more consistent with starting other types of View, Update 3 includes a shortcut located at **Home** tab > **Window** group > **Add Views** pulldown > **Create New Spatial Model Editor.**

We have also enhanced the Spatial Model Editor to persist the last state of the gridlines. Whichever state the Show Gridlines checkbox is set will determine how it is set when a new Spatial Model Editor is started.

Format Support

ICEYE SLC

ICEYE's small satellite SAR imaging constellation is customized for the high revisit rate and frequent delivery of high-resolution imagery.

Interferometric processing has now been tested using the limited set of available sample SLC (single look complex) datasets. Further optimizations will occur as additional samples are delivered.

RADARSAT Constellation Mission (RCM)

The RADARSAT Constellation Mission (RCM) is Canada's new generation of Earth observation satellites. Launched on June 12, 2019, the three identical satellites provide daily images of Canada's vast territory and maritime approaches, as well as images of the Arctic, up to four times a day. It also has daily access to 90 percent of the world's surface.

Maxar / DigitalGlobe WorldView Legion

Synthesized examples indicate the upcoming WorldView Legion sensor is supported via RPC and Orbital Pushbroom geometric models for orthorectification and other photogrammetric processing.


PRISMA L2D

PRISMA L2D hyperspectral data delivered in HDF5 format (.he5) now geolocates correctly.

Defense Gridded Elevation Data (DGED)

The Defense Gridded Elevation Data (DGED) reader now recognizes more vertical coordinate reference systems that can be defined in the data and correctly interprets the data as elevation rather than simply an image.





DiMAP v2 NoData

DiMAP v2 data (e.g., SPOT, Pleiades, Pleiades Neo, etc.) XML headers often define a NoData value. This value is now automatically used as the NoData value in ERDAS IMAGINE.

Pleiades Neo DiMAP Geometric Models

Pleiades Neo imagery is supported in both rigorous Orbital Pushbroom and RPC geometric models.

General ERDAS IMAGINE

Multi-band Thematic display

In previous updates, a multi-band thematic dataset, such as what is produced by ERDAS IMAGINE's supervised fuzzy classification tools, would default to open as a True Color display type. This default could be visually confusing. We have updated this display to ensure that despite the number of bands present in an image, if the first band is marked as thematic, the data will default to opening as Pseudo Color (band 1).

Escape Key

You can now dismiss dialogs using the industry-standard method of pressing the Esc key.

Lagrange Resampling

The Lagrange resampling method is now supported in IMAGINE Autosync (a part of the IMAGINE Expansion Pack product) and MosaicPro.



SIPS v2.4.15

We have updated the installer to use the Unclassified SIPS v2.4.15 XML file to control default Image Chain display parameters.

You can acquire extended versions of SIPS via the IMAGINE Defence Productivity Module (DPM).

IMAGINE Digital Surface Model (DSM) Extractor

You can now define a spatial subset to limit the area in which the Digital Surface Model (DSM) is extracted.

We have introduced a posting skip factor which specifies how many pixels will be skipped in the stereo pair in the X and Y directions during terrain extraction. Lower skip factor leads to denser point cloud output, and higher skip factor reduces computation time but leads to a sparser point cloud output.

IMAGINE SAR Feature

We have implemented two new classes of speckle suppression algorithms, including:

Artificial Intelligence Convolutional Neural Network (CNN) Despeckle

This function will process the radar image through a convolutional neural, network-based algorithm specifically trained to minimize speckle noise. This algorithm is fully automated and requires no user input.

Anisotropic and SuperPixel

This dialog enables the application of two sequential algorithms for a radar image. The first option, Despeckle, offers two forms of Anisotropic radiometric reconstruction – the Mixed-Norm algorithm and the Feature Preserving algorithm. Optionally, this step can be omitted by selecting "none".

The intermediate image from the Despeckle step is followed by the second Segmentation step. The Superpixel algorithm evaluates the pixel values (greyscale) and modifies them to produce coherent regions (i.e., sub-features). The Cluster version of the algorithm also reduces pixel size. Again, selecting "none" eliminates this step from the processing.

ERDAS IMAGINE System Requirements Notes

¹ Disk I/O is usually the slowest task in geospatial data processing. Faster hard disks improve productivity. Reading data from one disk, writing temporary data to a second disk, and writing data to a third disk improves performance. Disk arrays improve productivity, but some RAID options slow performance. Network disk drives are subject to network limitations.

² Server Operating Systems are not supported for IMAGINE Photogrammetry, ORIMA, or ERDAS ER Mapper.

³ The 3D stereo viewing and peripheral requirements of IMAGINE Photogrammetry limit its operating system options.

⁴ ERDAS ER Mapper is not supported on Windows 8. It is considered Viable on Windows 8.1.

⁵ Windows provides a generic OpenGL driver for all supported graphics cards; however, an OpenGLoptimized graphics card and driver are recommended for these applications.

In the session log attached near the end there are a lot of entries saying: "SessionMgr(14900): Image block count exceeds 2^32" Then the log ends with: "SessionMgr(14900): warptool.exe exited with status 255." Steps to replicate: 1. Open a local image file without reference in ERDAS IMAGINE 2. Prior to geoferencing, the customer calculates pyramids and statistics for this image 3. Open Multipoint Geometric Correction tool (Panchromatic > Transform & Orthocorrect > Control Points) 4. Choose "Polynomial" as Geometric Model 5. Choose the option "Bing Aerial Layer" for "Collect Reference Points From" 6. Keep default target projection "Pseudo Mercator / WGS 84" 7. Maximise the Multipoint tool 8. Start georeferencing: Zoom into the view with the unreferenced image, set the first point there, and afterwards set the corresponding reference point in the Bing Maps view 9. Repeat step 8 several times, but the last time try to swap the order for placing the points (set reference point > set unreferenced point). The placement of the reference point already causes the warptool to crash. |
| 00071901 | Some Sentinel-2 data fails to open with error "image file is missing" | All three of the Sentinel-2 importers fail to import some Sentinel-2 data resulting in the error "image file is missing". According to the data's manifest.safe file this is Level-1C data, but it appears to be labelled incorrectly. The data is actually Level 2A. |

Click Ok. In the opened dialog window activate Include Attributes option and click OK. Load the resulting .hpc file to the 2D View and open attribute table (Table tab > Show Attributes).
